THE VIKINGS' WORLD-FAMED POOL

"The greatest swimmers in the fastest pool at the greatest meet in history" is how the NCAA Swimming Guide described the 1977 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships held in the lightning-fast waters of the Cleveland State University pool.

If there were dissenters to that opinion they are yet to be heard from.

From the time the CSU Natatorium was opened to an admiring public and a proud student body in 1974 its reputation as one of the finest indoor competitive pools ever built has flourished throughout the land.

The last lingering doubts as to the authenticity of its claim to the title of America's "Super Pool" ended in March of 1975 when the nation's best swimmers and coaches came away singing its praises after the NCAA's Division II and Division I Championships were held in it on consecutive weekends.

Three National AAU Diving Championships, the 1977 and 1979 NCAA Division I Swimming and Diving Championships, the 1978 USA-Russia Diving Meet, the 1980 USA-China Diving Meet, a training camp for the 1976 USA Olympic Diving Team and a host of meets of slightly lesser stature have brought continuing tributes in the same vein.

What makes the CSU pool great?

Primarily a deep water competition course with races swum in lanes 12 to 16½ feet deep, exceptionally deep gutters that swallow up waves with the same ease with which Jonah was swallowed up by the whale, and crystal clear water with superb lighting which makes turn walls sharp and clear to competitors.

A mind-boggling 933,000 gallons of water fill the exhibition pool, which is 50 meters in length (with nine eight-foot competitive lanes), 25 yards wide (with 20 seven-foot competitive lanes), is equipped with underwater speakers and six underwater windows for coaching and teaching, and utilizes an ultra-sophisticated Omega automatic timing system with touch pads for up to 10 lanes during meets.

Diving facilities include two one-meter maxiflex boards, two three-meter maxiflex boards, and a diving tower with platforms at 5, 7½ and 10 meters. Each of the platform levels is served by an intercom which can be operated from the coach's position on deck.

The original seating capacity of nearly 1,600 has been augmented by the construction of special television broadcast and camera platforms built originally as temporary structures but converted to permanent facilities because of the frequent appearances of national TV crews. All three major networks — ABC, CBS and NBC — have originated telecasts from the Viking pool.

Tucked away out of sight of spectators beneath the south stands is a bonus for the competitive swimmer, a 25-yard instructional pool used for teaching instruction on a daily basis which serves as an ideal warm-up and/or warm-down pool during major competitions.

It's just a little extra among the many extras which make the Cleveland State pool THE pool in collegiate swimming.

MEN'S HEAD COACH WALLY MORTON -- A new era in Cleveland State swimming began with the 1981-82 season as Wally Morton assumed the head coaching reins which had been held so steadily for 30 years by the University's first All-American swimmer, Bob Busbey. The changeover went ever so smoothly as Busbey turned his full attention to the continuously growing responsibilities of the CSU athletic director's job which he has filled since 1966 and Morton, the assistant coach for the Vikings for seven seasons, moved to the head of the class. The Viking program scarcely skipped a beat as the team acquired another Penn-Ohio Conference title in 1982, finished in the upper echelon of the Eastern Intercollegiate, and qualified their first swimmer in four seasons for the NCAA Division I Championships. Morton's performance in his collegiate head coaching debut was hardly a surprise. A graduate of Miami (O.) University where he was a member of back-to-back Mid-American Conference championship swimming squads in 1966 and 1967, he soon after became the first physical director and swim coach of the Fairfield (O.) YMCA. There he developed a program which eventually grew to over 150 boys and girls and sent 19 swimmers to the YMCA National Championships. Morton came to CSU in 1974 -- one year after the CSU Natatorium had opened -- as Aquatics Director and Assistant Swimming Coach. He arrived just in time to direct the pool operations for the 1975 NCAA Divisions I AND II Swimming and Diving Championships. Since then he has served in the same capacity for two more NCAA Division I Championships and a lengthy list of additional major regional, national and international meets. As a result, he has become a well-known figure to most of the country's top swimming and diving coaches. Morton and his wife, Carol, an assistant professor of Health, Physical Education and Recreation at CSU, make their home in suburban Strongsville.

WOMEN'S HEAD COACH DEBBIE DUGAN made a triumphant return to her alma mater this year, turning in an 11-3 dual meet record in her first season as a head coach in the college ranks. Her performance came as absolutely no surprise to those who had watched her progress during an outstanding college career at Cleveland State. A standout as both a student (16th in a class of 820) and an athlete (track and basketball) at Eastlake (O.) North High School, she resumed competitive swimming after a two-year lapse when she enrolled at CSU in 1975. The results were spectacular. In each of her four seasons as a Viking she won the CSU Athletic Alumni Association Award as the "Most Outstanding Female Swimmer," an honor matched by only one other athlete in Cleveland State annals. When she wound up her competitive career in 1979 she owned or shared in 11 varsity records, and she had been the team captain for three consecutive seasons. Two years of teaching at the high school level in the Greater Cleveland area followed before she answered the call to return to her alma mater with the aforementioned excellent . . . but not surprising . . . results. Her coaching responsibilities were expanded in the spring to include the tutoring of the women's track team, and her career will take on a new facet in June when she marries Mike Rezzolla.



DIVING COACH JIM FEDOR, one of the finest divers ever produced at Cleveland State, began tutoring CSU's men and women divers in 1977-78. Now he seems destined to win recognition as an even better coach than he was a diver. Fedor products have dominated Penn-Ohio Conference meets and become an increasingly important factor in the Eastern Intercollegiate Championships. His most successful pupil, Jeff Dalman, qualified for four consecu-

utive NCAA Zone Diving Championships. Fedor himself was a place winner in the Penn-Ohio Meet for three straight years and qualified for the NCAA's in both his junior and senior years. A local product, Fedor attended Lakewood High School and now he and his wife, Carla, make their home in Cleveland, Ohio.

THE CSU SWIM STORY

Introduced as a varsity sport at old Fenn College in 1931-32, the men's program produced a resounding success saga for Fenn sports in 1935-36 when that year's team, under the direction of Coach Harry Kyr, stroked its way to a 9-1 season, the most successful varsity effort of the era. The team was disbanded during the war years, but swimming was revived in 1946-47 and in the next four year's proceeded to put little Fenn on the nation's intercollegiate sports map. With Ray Ray at the coaching helm, and a two-time All-American, Bob Busbey, spearheading the activities in the water, Fenn's Foxes took on all comers including such teams as Indiana and Yale and built a sensational 45-12 dual meet record. Ray left for Miami, O. after Busbey's graduation and Busbey took over the coaching reins a year later, beginning a regime which lasted 30 years. Although there were some notable successes -- particularly a 10-1 season in 1957-58 -- the next leap forward for CSU swimming did not take place until 1970 when All-American Jim Pence proved the key to an 11-3 season. Another College Division All-American, Kent Kirchner, arrived in 1971 to lead CSU to a 10-2 mark and there has not been a losing dual meet season since. The biggest step forward yet occurred in 1974 when CSU's nonpareil natatorium was opened. The Cleveland State pool soon became a symbol of excellence to American swimming buffs. The Cleveland State varsity program grew apace. The Viking men have captured seven of the last eight Penn-Ohio Conference championships and become a contender in the Eastern Intercollegiate Championships.

The women's team, just seven years old, has begun to build a tradition of its own. The ladies have enjoyed four straight winning seasons and showed dramatic improvements in their times each season. Their immediate goal is to reach the current status of the men's program, now recognized as one of the top three intercollegiate programs in Ohio. They're not far from that goal.
